

Dear Alumni and Friends,


We have accomplished a number of strategic priorities in the last several years, resulting in improvements in our facilities, curriculum, clinical experiences and community engagement. We have put check marks in a number of places on our 2010 Strategic Plan. That brings to reality what all of our work has meant to our Dental School community! Despite a challenging economic period, we have managed to move our School and its programs in a positive direction! We have created an orthodontic seminar room, opened a dental clinic in a K-12 charter school in the urban core, and developed exciting curriculum and assessment strategies for our students. We heard from our Rinehart Foundation Chair, Dr. Brett Ferguson, and our students who expressed their gratitude for the scholarship support we are able to give each year. We are also grateful to the many generous donors who include

our alumni, faculty, staff, industry representatives and friends of the UMKC School of Dentistry for the support that enables us to accomplish such great strides in a short amount of time. What we have accomplished would not be possible without each individual and group commitment to our School. Thank you!

As we look to the future, we will revisit our Strategic Plan so that we may set in motion the next set of "great accomplishments" for the UMKC School of Dentistry. We have many challenges and needs. The budget in our State remains challenging, requiring us to continue to do more with less. We have urgent need for upgrades to our aging facility, including public, clinical and research spaces. Our fundraising priorities for the next year (see page 14) include projects to upgrade our public space on the second floor where we greet parents, candidates, and groups to the School; upgrade our Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery clinic; and remodel our Advanced Education Periodontal Clinic.

On behalf of the School I thank you for your continued support of our shared mission to advance the profession of dentistry through education, service, research and clinical care. We look forward to working with you to continue the School's tradition of excellence.

A Practical Approach to Preparing Students for Dental Practice

As the director of the Dr. Charles Dunlap Innovation Center for Research, Education and Technology, I am charged with carrying out the vision that guided the Center's development: to provide our students with an educational experience that will enable them to more effectively transition from dental school to private practice. Because of our collaboration with the Center for Research and Education in Technology (CRET), a national group of leaders from the dental industry, we are able to give dental students an opportunity to work with brand new equipment and technology, develop practice management skills, and explore ethical challenges; in other words, to function in an environment that is not readily available in our general predoctoral clinics.

During the fall semester each fourth-year student will rotate through the Innovation Center. During their three weeks in the Center, they will rotate through its seven treatment rooms that are equipped with a variety of design features and ergonomic concepts. Their exposure to multiple operatory environments will give them invaluable experience that can inform their future purchasing decisions when, and if, they are in a position to acquire equipment.

One of the most exciting aspects of our collaboration with CRET is their ongoing commitment to regularly supply the Center with new equipment and technology. We all know how fast this area is changing. To give our students real-time access to the latest in design and concept will provide them with invaluable information as they transition into their professional careers.

During the spring semester the students will be able to schedule patient appointments in the Innovation Center whenever they choose. This will be a time for them to experience the practice management principles required to run a busy dental practice. They will perform simulation exercises and receive mentoring that will help them appreciate the need to schedule and manage for success.

Among the 60+ U.S. dental schools, we are one of two that are providing this type of transitional experience to ready our graduates for immediate immersion in the real world practice of dentistry. We believe the Innovation Center offers our students a unique opportunity to better prepare for their professional futures.

Center at the School of Dentistry," said School of Dentistry Dean Marsha Pyle. "It's crucial that students combine the foundational skills required to be an exceptional practitioner with the newest technologies to best serve the patient in an increasingly technology-driven world."

The Innovation Center at the School of Dentistry is a partnership with the Center for Research and Education in Technology (CRET), a group of leaders from the dental industry. CRET also has worked with Loma Linda School of Dentistry in California to create a clinic there; the UMKC School of Dentistry is CRET's second project.

"What was once a radical idea is now a reality," said Edward Rossomando, director of CRET and a professor at the University of Connecticut School of Dental Medicine. "The dental industry and dental educators can work together to integrate new technologies into the dental school curriculum."

Numerous manufacturers donated equipment to outfit the operatories in the 2,026-square-foot center. The Stanley H. Durwood Foundation and other alumnae and friends of the School honored the 45-year career of "Charlie" Dunlap (DDS '60) with the naming of the Center. About \$2.25 million was

raised to support the Center and its staffing. James Trotter (DDS, '76), a clinical assistant professor, serves as the Center's director.

harles Dunlap (DDS '60), professor emeritus of Oral Pathology, Radiology and Medicine, describes himself as a man of humble beginnings. Born near the end of The Great Depression on a farm five miles outside a very small Oklahoma town, he experienced the hardships of a simple and often difficult agrarian life. In those

early years he began to form his lifelong interest in relieving people and animals from suffering.

Throughout his professional career as an oral pathologist, he has been passionately committed to acquiring and sharing knowledge. During his nearly half a century of teaching and practicing oral

pathology, he has touched thousands of students and patients. He has never declined a patient nor charged a fee of a disadvantaged patient referred to him. Charlie firmly believes that he has a moral obligation to use his knowledge and skill to help others.

In 2009 a small group of alumni initiated a campaign to raise money in Dr. Dunlap's honor. When asked what cause he would like to have his name associated with, he responded that he was interested in a fund to help indigent patients who seek care in the School's clinics. Because of his own beginnings, he understands hardship and believes that among all the human traits, kindness and the desire to help others are the most valuable.

The Charles Dunlap Indigent Care

Fund is now making a remarkable difference in the lives of people experiencing difficult times. An example is a medically compromised 57-year-old male who has been diagnosed and treated for malignant glucagonoma, diabetes type II, and multiple endocrine neoplasia type I. Severe periodontitis necessitated 26

extractions, an expense that far exceeded his means. The generosity of the students, colleagues and friends who have supported the Charles Dunlap Indigent Care Fund helped pay for his oral surgery and provide him with partials.

Since 2011 the Dunlap Fund has financed the care of 25 patients whose care


has cost an average of \$660 and ranged from \$210 to \$1,200. Alumni have been very generous in their support to create the fund, donating over \$100,000. However, because the fund is structured as an endowment, only five percent of the corpus (about \$5,000) can be used each year. This restriction limits the amount of care the Fund can provide; consequently, Dr. Charles Dunlap has occasionally stepped forward to personally pick up the costs of a patient's care. Dr. Dunlap described a recent instance where one of the UMKC dental faculty who manage the care delivered by the Fund told him about a patient who required extraction of all teeth and construction of a removable denture.

"The patient lived alone and was in poor health, some of which was

attributable to her dental status," Charles Dunlap explained. "The cost was nearly \$2,500, which would drain the fund for the remaining fiscal year. The faculty member said the fund could pay all but about \$700. I gave the faculty member a check for the \$700, so the Fund's budget wouldn't be depleted. I am thrilled to be able to assist the Indigent Care Fund like this, but I am hopeful that we can grow the Fund's endowment and thereby increase its annual budget and the amount of care it can provide."

Ji Blanchfield was our classmate. Originally from Thailand, Ji came to Kansas City from New Mexico. Ji was in her second year of dental school when she was diagnosed with stage 4 colon cancer. She passed away a short time later on December 18, 2011. We started the Ji Blanchfield Memorial Scholarship Fund in her honor in the spring of 2012. We have asked students, faculty, friends and family for donations, and we have hosted a few fundraising events as well. We raised \$1,000 by recruiting sponsors for our participation in the Undie Run in St. Louis, Mo., which raises awareness of colon cancer. The class is now over halfway to our goal of \$10,000 creating a class scholarship before we've even graduated.

The latest issue of the publication Forum for Dental Student Research and Innovation has published an article written by third-year UMKC dental students Rebecca Kisling, Danielle Leeper, Bo Zhang, Myles Davidson, Jessica Scully, and Lisa Alford. In the article, titled "Students' Impressions on the IADR Conference: Presenting Inspiration, Insight, and Opportunities," the authors describe their experiences and thoughts related to participating in research as Summer Dental Scholars (in 2012) and then presenting their

research at the 2013 International Association for Dental Research (IADR) conference held during March 2013 in Seattle, Wash.

Each year the UMKC Summer Scholars Program invites dental students who rank in the top one-half of their class to apply to the program. Those selected receive a stipend and, more importantly, have the opportunity to participate in research projects in collaboration with faculty mentors. During the 9-week program students work in the dental school's laboratories

and clinics. At the end of the program, students produce a research paper, give an oral presentation, and submit a research abstract for a national meeting, most frequently the American Association for Dental Research (AADR). Later in the year, students attend the AADR national meeting where they present their research results in oral or poster presentations. Upon successful completion of the program, students earn one credit hour of independent study.



Alums Are Helping U.S. Army "Go First Class"

Who says there's no "good" news in the news anymore? I am happy to report that a new U.S. Army dental program, aptly named "Go First Class," has proven to be extremely popular with our troops as well as the media. A recent article showcasing our new streamlined approach to treating soldiers was published through PRWeb and has been picked up by 106 news outlets, including: the LA Daily News, San Francisco Chronicle, Boston Globe, Daily Herald, Miami Herald, and the Kansas City Star. From inception to implementation, I led the Go First Class (GFC) initiative with assistance from Ken Dunn (DDS '87) (above left). GFC incorporates process flow efficiencies that can quickly increase the oral health of patient in one visit. Of course, patients with moderate to advanced disease, those that require complex treatment, will have to return to the clinic for continued care. GFC is being standardized across all 130 Army dental clinics around the world with the intent that no matter what dental clinic a soldier enters, he or she will go through the same process in order to receive a consistent patient experience. I thought this information may be of special interest to the UMKC School of Dentistry, as many of my former UMKC instructors had served in the Armed Forces — not to mention all the graduates that continue to volunteer for service.

Among her many professional accomplishments, she has served as the faculty advisor for the UMKC student chapter of the American Dental Hygienists' Association since 2005, and she has been recognized with a variety of awards: Lecturer of the Year, Clinical Teacher of the Year, Faculty of the Year, and Distinguished Teaching Award (multiple times).

School Announces Renovation Projects

As we continue to create new programs in the School that keep us on the forefront of dental education, it is vital that our facilities do so as well. In spite of challenging economic times, we have managed to accomplish some of our goals. For instance, thanks to the philanthropic generosity of numerous alumni and friends, we recently christened the Dr. Charles Dunlap Innovation Center for Research and Education in Technology (see page 4). This state-of-the-art clinical facility will be a wonderful recruitment tool for new students and a shining example of our commitment to our students' educational success.

But it has become clear that the state of Missouri will not be able to assist us with much-needed renovations within our building, so we are moving forward with updating sections of the building on our own. Although there are many worthy areas in the building that need our attention, we are presently targeting four specific areas for renovation: the second floor entrance, the Oral Surgery Clinic, the Periodontal Clinic and the Preclinic labs.

Pre-Clinic Labs

Because nothing is more important than the success of our students, we must be able to incorporate the latest technological advancements in the hands-on experiences that enable them to hone their clinical skills. To continue this tradition we must update the labs and their equipment to help keep us current and competitive in attracting and producing the best students.

Estimated Cost: \$1.2 million

Oral Surgery Suite

Oral Surgery and the procedures that happen within are an important part of our students' clinical experience. This renovation will be a big undertaking with 4,900 square feet of space and numerous operatories this project will involve electrical, plumbing, equipment and more. The end result will be well worth the effort.

Estimated Cost: \$2,548,000

Periodontics Suite

Our faculty in this suite have gone above and beyond to make sure other projects in the school get attention and now it is their turn. With 2,000 square feet of space we have the opportunity to create a State Of The Art educational experience and address some much needed updates.

Estimated Cost: \$520,000

Second Floor Renovation

As the main entrance for a significant portion of our visitors and a meeting place for our didactic sessions, this area could use a little polish. We plan to update the look and maneuverability of both doors and enhance the hallways and open space to better direct traffic.

Estimated Cost: \$141,000

Congratulations to Our 2014 UMKC "Alumni Achievement" Awardees

Dr. Connie Drisko has been selected to receive the



2014 Dental Alumni Achievement award. Dr. Drisko followed a 16-year career as a dental hygienist by earning her DDS degree at the UMKC School of Dentistry in 1980. She then joined the School's faculty as an associate professor and distinguished herself with teaching awards, research grants and community service. From

2003 through July 2013 she served as dean and Merritt Professor of the Georgia Health Sciences University (GHSU) College of Dental Medicine in Augusta, Ga. During her tenure as only the third dean of the College of Dental Medicine, student enrollment grew significantly. Drisko directed the funding, design and construction of a \$112 million, five-story clinical facility, one of the largest of its kind in the country. In recent years the American Dental Association recognized her institution for its student diversity programs to prepare underrepresented minority and low income students for careers in dentistry. She continues to serve on the College's faculty.

Dorinda Ball (DH '03) has been selected to receive the



2014 Dental Hygiene Alumni Achievement award. Ball began her career in public health with the Indian Health Service in Parker, Ariz., where she worked in a remote area to provide oral health promotion to that population. Her current assignment is working in Washington, D.C., at the U.S. Public Health Service (USPHS)

in the Federal Bureau of Prisons Central Office as a program management officer. Her duties are aimed at the recruitment of healthcare students and providers to positions in the 119 prisons under the auspices of the federal government. In 2008, Ball received the USPHS Achievement Medal for her "exemplary performance, dedication, leadership and invaluable contribution while providing the highest standard of service during the U.S.N.S. Mercy Pacific Partnership 2008 mission." A recognized leader and valuable contributor to her peers and supervisors, she has received multiple Outstanding Unit Citation Awards during her tenure at the U.S. Public Health Service.

The Rinehart Foundation:



A Living Legacy

ersonally, I don't think we can ever be reminded enough of the School of Dentistry's rich and distinguished history. Not only are we the eldest of UMKC's professional schools, we are nearly as old as Kansas City itself. We came into being in1881 as the Kansas City Dental College, a mere 31 years after Kansas City was born. We have been known by many names: Kansas City Dental College, Western Dental College, Kansas City-Western Dental College (the result of the aforementioned institutions merging in 1919), Lincoln and Lee University School of Dentistry, University of Kansas City (UKC) School of Dentistry, and finally, the University of Missouri-Kansas City (UMKC) School of Dentistry. But there is only one name that binds the history of these names together: Dr. Roy James Rinehart.

A 1903 graduate of Western Dental College, Dr. Rinehart began teaching crown and bridge there in 1913 and continued until his death in 1957. After the founder and first dean of the Western Dental College, Dr. D.J. McMillen, died in 1913, Dr. Rinehart and two other area dentists purchased the College from Dr. McMillen's

widow in 1916 to ensure its continued existence. He became dean of Western Dental College 1918, then served as secretary (assistant dean) of the newly formed Kansas City-Western Dental College and as its dean from 1928 until his death. To honor Dr. Rinehart's remarkable contributions to dentistry, Dr. Joseph F. Jacobs, a professor of periodontics, led the way to establish the Dr. Roy James Rinehart Memorial Foundation in 1958. In addition to raising funds for a new building, the newly formed Rinehart Foundation would also:

- Assist the University and the School of Dentistry in promoting the dental health of the general public through teaching and research."
- Improve the physical facilities at the University for the instruction and research in the dental health field.
- Make grants to students and faculty members.
- Establish chairs of learning and teaching at the School of Dentistry.

The corpus of the Foundation reached \$9.6 million in September 2013, and will soon exceed \$16 million thanks to the bequest of Robert (DDS '49) and

Lucille Cowan of Branson, Mo. Another measure of the Foundation's strength as well as the generosity of the School's alumni and friends is the more than 130 scholarship funds that have been endowed by grateful graduating classes, as well as individual alumni and their colleagues, families, friends, and loved ones. The gratitude they have expressed through their giving is matched only by that of the scholarship students whose lives and livelihoods have been profoundly changed by their generosity.

The people who were students during Dean Rinehart's era invariably describe him with fond appreciation. They say he was a kind man, a thoughtful man, a caring man, a generous man. Those qualities live on today in the Foundation that bears his name. It is safe to say that the people who support the Rinehart Foundation carry on his legacy of kindness, thoughtfulness, caring, and generosity. Just as Dr. Rinehart represents our shared past, the incredible people who support the Rinehart Foundation represent our shared future. Without him our shared history would be much less colorful and without your financial support our shared future will be much less bright. Thank you for your continued support.




