
Dental Hygiene Students National Competition

Dr. Charles Dunlap (DDS '60) **Dental Alumnus of the Year**

Dr. Charles (Charlie) Dunlap serves as the Rinehart Professor of Dentistry and chair of the Department of Oral Pathology, Radiology and Medicine at the UMKC School of Dentistry. He also holds an appointment as professor of medicine at the UMKC School of Medicine. Born in Stigler, Okla., Dr. Dunlap graduated from Northeast Oklahoma State College in Tahlequah in 1956 as a chemistry major. After graduating from UMKC, he joined the Army as an officer in the Dental Corps. He spent a year of study in pathology at the Armed

Forces Institute of Pathology (AFIP) on the Walter Reed campus in Washington, D.C. He then spent another year studying pathology at the University of Kansas. In 1964 Dunlap joined UMKC's faculty as an assistant professor in oral pathology. He became board certified in 1967 and served as president of the American Board of Oral Pathology in 1980. He served as president of the American Academy of Oral

Pathology in 1980-81. From 1978 to 1985 he served as chair of the Council on Dental Education. He served three terms as a member of the UMKC Faculty Senate and two terms as chair of the UMKC Faculty Council. He has been honored as a recipient of the school's Outstanding Teacher Award 26 times and the Distinguished Teacher Award 19 times. The University honored him with the Elmer Pierson Outstanding Teacher award in 1984-85.

To honor Dr. Dunlap's long and distinguished career, a small group of alumni initiated a fundraising campaign. When he was asked what cause he would like to have his name associated with, Dunlap said he would like to help indigent patients at the School of Dentistry. To honor his wishes, an endowment is being established to provide assistance to patients who have acute dental needs but lack financial resources to pay for treatment. This fund, to be held in the Rinehart Foundation, will ensure that the compassion Dr. Dunlap shows for people in need can continue after his retirement, and even after his lifetime.

Ray Storm (DDS '78) UMKC Alumni Achievement Award Dentistry

Dr. Ray Storm heard the call to medicine before he heard the call to duty with the U.S. Navy and the Marine Corps, but his experiences in Vietnam caused him to change directions. During his last tour, Storm met a dentist who suggested that Storm's medical background and interest and ability in art made him a good

candidate for a career in dentistry. The dentist he met was right. Storm has won numerous awards and honors, including several Golden Apple Awards from the American Dental Association, and he was twice named Missouri Dentist of the Year by the Missouri Dental Association.

A community volunteer, Storm has served as president of PATCHES, a not-for-profit dental missionary organization. He also founded and served as president of Give Kids a Smile, an organization that brings quality dental care to the underserved. "To date," Storm says, "we have seen over 8,200 children and have provided over \$3 million in services." Storm also works with his wife in their general practice in St. Peters, Mo.

Dr. Storm was honored with the award at the UMKC Alumni Association's 2010 Celebration Awards Luncheon, held in UMKC's Pearson Auditorium, April 22, 2010. He was among the 16 outstanding alumni and one family recognized for their accomplishments and dedication to society and their alma mater. More than 400 people packed Pierson for the sold-out event, which honored an alumni achievement awardee from each school along with the five campus-wide awardees and Chancellor's Medalist.

Caren Barnes was a senior in the dental hygiene program at Texas Women's University when she spoke with the only person holding a master's degree in Dental Hygiene in the state of Texas. That conversation inspired Barnes to come to UMKC to earn the same master's degree in 1974. Now a professor



She serves on the editorial review boards of several industry publications, and her work has appeared in many dental care and hygiene publications, including several invited manuscripts in Dental Clinics of North America, Wilkin's Clinical Practice. She also serves the community, volunteering and speaking at dental health events around the country.

Bonnie Receives National Honor Branson Award for Excellence in Dental Hygiene

Dr. Bonnie Branson, a professor in the UMKC Division of Dental Hygiene, was one of three recipients to be honored with the prestigious Johnson & Johnson Healthcare Products/ADHA Award for Excellence in Dental Hygiene. She was presented with the award during the President's Luncheon at the American Dental Hygienists' Association's 2010 Annual Session, held June 27 in Las Vegas, Nev. According to the ADHA, the award "recognizes hygienists who have evidence of active involvement in ADHA and its constituents, exhibit evidence of

leadership in and the advancement of dental hygiene experience, provide evidence for the incorporation of any and/or all roles of the dental hygienist to document outstanding accomplishments that have a significant impact on the practice and future of the dental hygiene profession."

As a member of ADHA since 1972, Branson has served the organization in a variety of capacities at the national level and at the state level in Utah, Illinois and Missouri. Currently she is the chair of the ADHA Institute for Oral Health Research Grant Review Committee.

Branson, who holds a doctorate from Southern Illinois University, joined UMKC's faculty in 1998. Previously, she served as a program director for the Weber State University Dental Hygiene Program and director of the College Cooperative Education Program at Southern Illinois University. In addition to her academic duties at UMKC, Branson recently served as the oral health project director for the state of Missouri and headed the Preventive Services Program, which provided 35,000 children with fluoride varnish, education and oral health assessments annually.
