The UMKC Bachelor of Science in Dental Hygiene (BSDH) expands professional opportunities beyond the private dental office to areas such as corporate, administration, public health, research, and education. Our courses prepare graduates to step into leadership roles, find diverse jobs and work collaboratively with other health care professionals.

Application Process

- · Completion of prerequisites with satisfactory GPA
- General application to UMKC
- Supplemental application to the Division of Dental Hygiene
- Three letters of recommendation
- Official transcripts
- Transferology report

Admissions Prerequisites

- Satisfactory completion of approximately two years of college.
- Minimum cumulative and science prerequisite GPA of 2.75
- Accepted students' average science GPA: 3.4/cumulative GPA: 3.5
- Complete UMKC General Education Core
- Complete dental hygiene specific pre-requisites:
 - + General Biology or equivalent
 - + College Chemistry I with lab
 - + Microbiology
 - + Human Anatomy
 - + Human Physiology
 - + Public Speaking or Interpersonal Communication
 - + Introduction to Sociology
 - + Introduction to Psychology
 - + College Algebra

(totaling approximately 58 college credit hours)

Reserved Admissions Program

The Reserved Admissions Program for the BSDH degree at UMKC enables highly motivated students who are in their senior year of high school to apply directly for a reserved seat in a future dental hygiene class. Accepted students are able to participate in developmental opportunities with the Office of Student Programs throughout their first two years of college. Once candidates meet the full criteria they are allowed to bypass the traditional dental hygiene application process for admission.

Criteria to apply for the Reserved Admissions Program:

- 24 ACT
- 3.5 high school GPA (unweighted)
- Commit to taking prerequisite coursework at UMKC
- · Apply in early spring

Students must maintain the following criteria once in college:

- 3.4 College GPA and Science GPA
- 30 hours of community service per year
- 30 hours of dental hygiene shadowing per year
- Required meeting with DH admissions adviser after first semester of college
- Participate in extracurricular/leadership activities

The UMKC Doctor of Dental Surgery (DDS) is a clinic-based program focused on comprehensive care. The program includes rigorous academics, methodical training and a commitment to building leaders that improve lives through oral health. It emphasizes evidence-based dentistry as well as immersive clinical experience. Our team-based model allows students to gain clinical experience starting in year one along with provides courses every semester about the business side of dentistry.

Admissions Process and Prerequisites

Students are eligible to apply following the completion of 90 college credit hours provided they are continuing to work toward completion of a bachelor's degree. An application for admission must be submitted to the American Association of Dental Schools Application Service (AADSAS). The online application is available at the American Dental Education Association's website (www.adea.org). We review the entire scope of information that is available for each applicant: academic record (science GPA and DAT scores), essay; responses on the UMKC Application Survey; letters of recommendation; interview assessment and any other information provided by the candidate.

Objective Criteria:

Preference is given to candidates with a science GPA of 3.4 or higher and/or a DAT academic average of 17 or higher. Applicants must have at least a 3.0 science GPA and a 16 DAT academic average. Preferred DAT subscores are a 16 and above.

Subjective Criteria:

- Demonstrated investigation of the profession of dentistry
- Evidence of active and on-going social conscience and compassion
- Indication of fundamental personal character
- Evidence of critical thinking/problem solving
- Established effective interpersonal and communication skills
- Demonstrated ability to balance full academic schedules with extracurricular involvement or employment

Reserved Admissions Program

The Reserved Admission Program for the DDS degree at UMKC enables highly motivated, ambitious, talented Missouri and Kansas residents to pursue a dentistry degree. As a Reserved Admission Program student you apply for admission directly to the School of Dentistry without going through the national application service required of traditional DDS candidates.

To be eligible to apply for Reserved Admission you must have completed a minimum of, but not more than, four semesters of college credit while being continuously enrolled in full-time course loads (a minimum of 15 credit hours per semester).

Your science grade point average must be at least 3.6 in a degree-seeking program. Once accepted into the program, you must maintain a 3.6 science GPA, score a 19 on the Dental Admissions Test, and meet expectations of the subjective criteria.

What does a dentist do?

Dentists provide patients' restorative oral health care needs. They diagnose and treat diseases and injuries, and perform surgical procedures such as fillings, implants, tissue grafts, and extractions. Dentists are licensed and receive the Doctor of Dental Surgery degree.

What does a dental hygienist do?

Dental hygienists focus on the preventive care and maintenance of the mouth and teeth. They perform screenings and cleanings, as well as promote oral health care both on an individual patient-provider level and out in the wider community. Dental hygienists are licensed and receive either an Associate's or a Bachelor's in Dental Hygiene.
